## **ABOUT SENIOR SERVICES**

Since 1962, Senior Services has been helping older adults remain in their homes for as long as possible, aging with dignity and living with purpose through a variety of supportive programs and services.

The Meals-on-Wheels and Senior Lunch programs are designed to help meet the nutritional and social needs of participants. Our Home Care program assists older adults with personal care activities in their homes, while Living-at-Home, a Medicaid waiver program, helps bring nursing home levels of care to participants in their own homes through care management. The Aging Resources department provides referrals and valuable community resource information to older adults and their families through our Help Line. Our award-winning Elizabeth and Tab Williams Adult Day Center provides a safe and caring place, five days a week, for people living with frailty, Alzheimer's, and other forms of dementia. The Senior Services Creative Connections program aims to reduce social isolation, identify and provide resources to people living with memory loss, and provide opportunities for intergenerational engagement.

Individuals who cannot afford to pay for our services are of special concern to Senior Services and receive assistance to every extent possible through philanthropic contributions and available public funds.

The Senior Services campus is home to our administrative building and the state-of-the-art Intergenerational Center for Arts and Wellness (Generations Center), which houses the Williams Center and 20 other local organizations dedicated to working together to create opportunities for intergenerational experiences and activities that benefit seniors, and everyone.

## **MEMBER EXPECTATIONS**

- Commit to a minimum of one 3-year term and serve no more than two terms
- Invite one person to learn more
- Volunteer to deliver on the Service Alliance/Board Member Meals-on-Wheels route at least once per year.
- Volunteer for at least one Senior Services event/special campaign (volunteering with the Mealson-Wheels route is not counted toward this).
- Make a gift to the Senior Services annual fund that is comfortable and appropriate for you. Members are invited to meet with a member of the agency's Development Team to create their individual plan for giving.
- Assist with the Service Alliance annual signature "Brewery Event" fundraiser/friendraiser as a kick-off to the Senior Services Christmas in July item drive.
- Attend 75% of regularly scheduled meetings. Members are expected to provide advanced notice if they cannot attend regularly scheduled meetings.



## **LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE**

Service Alliance leadership consists of a Chair, Co-Chair, Immediate Past Chair, and Secretary

- Persons serving in leadership roles commit to a two-year term. They will hold those positions and remain active for three years (two years active, one as immediate past).
- The Service Alliance Chair will serve on the Senior Services Board of Directors.
- Service Alliance Co-chair/Vice-Chair will serve on the Senior Services Foundation Board of Directors. Note: members in this role may extend their Service Alliance tenure.
- The Service Alliance Secretary will be responsible for capturing key notes, meeting scheduling, and other core group communications, as needed.

# **MEETING SCHEDULE**

Monthly meetings are scheduled to alternate between morning, afternoon (virtually), and evenings to help promote maximum attendance. Meetings will happen on the last Wednesday of the month<sup>\*</sup> and the locations of these meetings will be provided via online calendar invitations (Govenda).

#### VOLUNTEER

#### **Meals-on-Wheels Route**

We rely on volunteers to help deliver more than 1,000 hot and frozen nutritious meals to older adults who have difficulty leaving their homes and cannot safely prepare meals for themselves each weekday. The designated Service Alliance route takes place on the first Thursday of each month. Members are expected to sign up to deliver at least once per year. The scheduling and frequency of this volunteer opportunity is flexible.

This is a great volunteer opportunity because it allows you to be hands-on and interact directly with the people Senior Services is helping. It also provides for team and relationship building while doing something great! Volunteers will provide their own transportation and typically deliver in pairs or with a few people in separate vehicles.



- <u>Frequency</u>: One or two Service Alliance members once per month
  - Time Shared: First Thursday of the month | 9:30 AM-noon | about 60 minutes per route

#### **Williams Adult Day Center**

The Williams Center provides a safe and nurturing place for people living with frailty and/or memory loss to spend the day. This allows their caregivers to continue to work, run errands, or just get a bit of rest from their caregiving duties. Service Alliance members are welcomed to volunteer at the Williams Center helping with programs, activities, and lunch service support.

- <u>Frequency</u>: Flexible
- <u>Time Shared</u>: Monday–Friday | 7:00 AM–5:00 PM | ~2 hours

#### **Administration**

Operating an agency with the size and scope of Senior Services involves a lot of moving parts. We are frequently looking for assistance with a variety of administrative and office tasks including bulk mailings, filing, shredding, counting and sorting comfort and care items, and packing care bags for families we serve. In addition, we are always grateful to have the assistance of a team's specific skills and/or professional expertise to further our mission. These opportunities often allow groups to meet and interact with staff and learn more about Senior Services and the impact of our services on the community.

- Frequency: Flexible
  - <u>Time Shared</u>: Monday–Friday | 8:00 AM–4:00 PM | 1–3 hours

#### **Beautification Projects**

We take pride in the appearance of our space and grounds. We love to have groups come in to lend a helping hand with various indoor and outdoor cleaning and beautification projects. Dusting, vacuuming, cleaning coolers, planting flowers, and/or washing the Senior Services vehicles can be surprisingly fun—when done in a group.



- Frequency: Up to you!
- <u>Time Shared</u>: Monday–Friday | 8:00 AM–4:00 PM | 1–2 hours based on availability
